During the Lenten season many people give something up or add something to their daily lives as a way to remember and honor the forty days Jesus spent in the wilderness fasting and in prayer to prepare for his ministry. We're fasting from color in our bulletins and the art that is at the top of the bulletin.

Offerings are what we give on top of that, recognizing that the world needs to know generosity and love that exceeds expectation.

This Sunday is the first Sunday of the month, which means we collect our **Coins for Hunger!** Coins for Hunger is about how a small act of gratitude—one or two coins at each meal—can be transformative. Your coins turn into funds that are sent to Religious Community Services in New Bern where feeding people is one of the things they do. RCS served 94,520 meals in 2022 at a cost of \$1.75 per meal.
