Where did the color go?

During the Lenten season many people give something up or add something to their daily lives as a way to remember and honor the forty days Jesus spent in the wilderness fasting and in prayer to prepare for his ministry. We're fasting from color in our bulletins and the art that is at the top of the bulletin.

The Passing of the Peace is an ancient ritual where we extend the forgiveness we have received with the words, "The peace of Christ be with you," hearing "and also with you" in response. The passing of the peace stresses what we hold in common---we are all in need of God's grace and it is this grace that holds us together in community.

*Affirmation of Faith from the Confession of 1967, Inclusive Language Text God's reconciling act in Jesus Christ is a mystery which the Scriptures describe in various ways. It is called the sacrifice of a lamb, a shepherd's life given for his sheep, atonement by a priest; again it is ransom of a slave, payment of debt, vicarious satisfaction of a legal penalty, and victory over the powers of evil. These are expressions of a truth which remains beyond the reach of all theory in the depths of God's love for humankind. They reveal the gravity, cost, and sure achievement of God's reconciling work.
