<sup>19</sup> It was still the first day of the week. That evening, while the disciples were behind closed doors because they were afraid of the Jewish authorities, Jesus came and stood among them. He said, "Peace be with you." <sup>20</sup> After he said this, he showed them his hands and his side. When the disciples saw the Lord, they were filled with joy. <sup>21</sup>Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father sent me, so I am sending you. <sup>22</sup>Then he breathed on them and said, "Receive the Holy Spirit. <sup>23</sup>If you forgive anyone's sins, they are forgiven; if you don't forgive them, they aren't forgiven."

<sup>24</sup> Thomas, the one called Didymus, one of the Twelve, wasn't with the disciples when Jesus came. <sup>25</sup> The other disciples told him, "We've seen the Lord!"

But he replied, "Unless I see the nail marks in his hands, put my finger in the wounds left by the nails, and put my hand into his side, I won't believe."

- <sup>26</sup> After eight days his disciples were again in a house and Thomas was with them. Even though the doors were locked, Jesus entered and stood among them. He said, "Peace be with you." <sup>27</sup> Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here. Look at my hands. Put your hand into my side. No more disbelief. Believe!"
- <sup>28</sup> Thomas responded to Jesus,
   "My Lord and my God!"
   <sup>29</sup> Jesus replied, "Do you believe because you see me?
   Happy are those who don't see and yet believe."

<sup>30</sup> Then Jesus did many other

miraculous signs in his disciples' presence, signs that aren't recorded in this scroll.

31 But these things are written so that you will believe that Jesus is the Christ, God's Son, and that believing, you will have life in his name. (Common English Bible)

## A New Adult Education Session Begins Today!

We invite you to find a place to grow your faith. Pick up an Adult Education brochure to find out about weekly opportunities for gathering and growth.

Creation Care: Exploring Ways to Talk and Act with Love - Many of us are concerned about the environment, and most of us are weary of the fractious debates often associated with this topic. If you are interested in learning more about how to understand, communicate about, and meaningfully address the challenges of climate change, join us for this spring class taught by Helen Robinson and Sara Schweitzer. This class will discuss Katharine Hayhoe's 2021 book, Saving Us: A Climate Scientist's Case for Hope and Healing in a Divided World. You can pick up a copy of the book in the office workroom. This class meets in the Owl Room (Ministry Center, second floor).

The Present Word is an in-depth Bible study for adults that dives deep into God's Word, studying the Bible over a six-year period and focusing on a specific theme each quarter. The goals of *The Present Word* curriculum are to engage in a serious study of Scripture to discover its deeper meaning and how it is relevant today. In the Spring quarter, we explore the fullness of faith as a response to God's desire to be in relationship with us. It meets in the Session House Parlor and is led by George Evans.

The Story condenses the Bible into 31 accessible chapters and sweeps you into the unfolding progression of Bible characters and events from Genesis to Revelation. Using the clear, accessible text of the New International Version (NIV) Bible, it allows the stories, poems, and teachings of the Bible to read like a novel, opening participants' eyes to God's master plan, unfolding in the lives of the Bible's characters as well as their own lives. This class is led by Dick Betts and Lana Brunk, and meets in the Conference Room (Ministry Center, first floor). Everyone is welcome!
