In 1983 the two largest Presbyterian denominations in the United States voted to come back together, healing the split that occurred in 1861, forming the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.). One of our first actions was to begin work on a new statement of faith that would be the words of the entire denomination. The **Brief Statement of** Faith was approved in 1991, and, as the most recent entry in our Book of Confessions, it is playing a significant role in Confirmation Classes this spring.

First Presbyterian Preschool (FPP) has been a ministry of First Presbyterian Church since 1993. It enrolls 100 students each year from August-May ranging in age from 6 weeks to PreK. For the 2024-2025 school year, FPP will operate Monday-Friday from 8:30 am - 12:30 pm. During the summer months, it offers 6 weeks of day camps to the community. On average, FPP awards \$15,000 in scholarships annually. Proceeds from today's BBQ Chicken Lunch will help replenish the scholarship fund. Thank you for your


support of this ministry. Kids at FPP know the love of Jesus and this church family!
