In 1983 the two largest Presbyterian denominations in the United States voted to come back together, healing the split that occurred in 1861, forming the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.). One of our first actions was to begin work on a new statement of faith that would be the words of the entire denomination.

The Brief Statement of **Faith** was approved in 1991, and, as the most recent entry in our Book of Confessions, it is playing a significant role in Confirmation Classes this Spring.

What are God's Tithes and our Offerings? Biblically, tithes are 10% of all that we receive-the goal we set for ourselves. Practically, it is the % you set aside first and give in recognition of the centrality of your relationship with God. Offerings are what we give above 10%, recognizing that the world needs to know generosity and love that exceeds expectation.
