The Christ Candle

We encourage PW to use the Christ Candle as a constant reminder that all we do is done in His name.

The PWP of New Hope Symbol



The dominant symbol on the banner of the Presbyterian Women of the Presbytery of New Hope is a descending dove over the open Bible. This shows the inspiration of the Holy Spirit founded on the Word. Centering their lives on the guidance of the Spirit and the Word, three women, representing varied races and backgrounds, interlink hands to show unity through cooperative effort. The Cross represents forgiveness. The descent of the Dove leads into the crossed keys of the Kingdom of God, which are surrounded by the olive branches of peace toward which all Presbyterian Women work and aspire to achieve

GUIDELINES FOR LOCAL CHURCHES HOSTING PW GATHERINGS

Hosting a gathering for Presbyterian Women – The gifts of time, resources and hospitality contribute significantly to strengthening the connection between Presbyterian Women in the local congregation (PWC) and the Presbyterian Women in the Presbytery (PWP).

General Information:

- Traditionally we hold one Spring Gathering for the entire PW of the Presbytery and three separate Fall Gatherings, when possible, for
 - Areas 1,2 and 3; Areas 4, 5 and 6; and Areas 7, 8 and 9.
- The PW of New Hope Presbytery budget provides funds to help with Host Church PW expenses: \$25 for a Fall Gathering (several areas) and \$100 for a Spring Gathering (presbytery-wide).
- Local Churches are needed to host PW of New Hope Presbytery Coordinating Team Meetings quarterly on a Saturday. Facilities and set-up needed include meeting space with tables and chairs, bathroom access, coffee and water for approximately 25 people.
- The Host Church PW point of contact with the PW of New Hope Presbytery Coordinating Team is their PWP Area Representative.
PW Fall Gatherings in recent years had an average attendance of 45 to 55.
PW Spring Gatherings in recent years had an average attendance of 75 to 85.

Local Churches are needed to host PW of New Hope Presbytery Coordinating Team Meetings quarterly on a Saturday. Facilities and set-up needed include meeting space with tables and chairs, bathroom access, coffee and water for approximately 25 people.

Recommended preparations for Fall and Spring Gatherings:

Facilities

- Fellowship/Registration begins one hour before the program.
 - The Host Church PW is requested to provide light refreshments during this fellowship time.
- Fall Gathering Program may be held in a Fellowship Hall or the Sanctuary.
- Spring Gathering Program is usually held in the Sanctuary.
- The Host Church is requested to provide:
 - a microphone and podium for the Gathering program
 - table for the Christ Candle provided by the PW of New Hope Presbytery Spiritual Enrichment Communicator for the Gathering.
- The PW of New Hope Presbytery Coordinating Team (PWPCT) member responsible for the PWP Banner. They will bring and set up the stand and banner for the Gathering.
- The Host Church PW will provide Registration and Resources areas with adequate tables, at least the following five 6-foot tables: (Note: Organizations' representatives will be requested by PWP Area Representative)

- Registration (Host Church PW can decide if more tables are needed at registration),
- PW Resources
- Children's Hope Alliance
- Church World Services
- Church Women United
- Additional Tables may be needed for
 - in-kind mission project collections.
 - Silent Auction items.
- Two or three workshop areas with at least 15 to 20 chairs each may be needed for a Fall Gathering
- Bathrooms clearly marked (using both men's and women's bathrooms, if needed).

Gathering

The agenda varies annually, confirm workshops with PWP Area Representative.

- Registration Form: Prior to the meeting the PW of Hew Hope Presbyterian Coordinating Team (PWPCT) will prepare the Registration Form with the Host Church PW providing:
 - Registrar name and contact information
 - Available parking directions
 - Nearby restaurant recommendations, if lunch is not being served, or
 - Cost of meal if lunch is offered.
- Registration
 - Registration and fellowship normally begin at 9 a.m. with the program starting at 10 a.m.
 - Host Church PW will provide printed name tags prepared in advance of the Gathering according to the early registration. Include the attendees' church names on their name tags. Host Church PW will have blank nametags available to be used as needed.
- Program
 - The Gathering Program/Bulletin will be prepared by members of the PWPCT in cooperation with the Host Church PW moderator and her Gathering Committee.
 - PWPCT will arrange the keynote speaker and will ask the speaker for any special hymn requests to share with the Host Church PW.
 - Host Church PW is requested to make copies of the program/bulletin.
 - Host Church PW secures organist/pianist, selects hymns (taking into consideration any special requests of the keynote speaker) and arranges any special music, if included.
 - Host Church PW provides ushers for seating, offering and any necessary assistance.
 - Host Church PW provides a minister, elders and the elements for communion, traditionally

served at Spring Gatherings.

- Communion is traditionally not served at Fall Gatherings.
- Host Church PW Moderator gives welcome and includes any “housekeeping” details (locations of exits and bathrooms).
- Registrar for Gatherings (Host Church PW registrar) will acknowledge only the churches present with an abbreviated roll call.
- Host Church PW Moderator reads the credentials report which includes:
 - Number of people attending (number provided to Host Church PW Moderator by Host Church PW registrar)
 - Amount and recipient of the offering* (amount provided to Host Church PW Moderator by her head usher)
 - Amount of monetary donations and mention of receiving in-kind donations for mission project*, and amount raised with Silent Auction (if held) and recipient* (collected during Fellowship/Registration, monetary amounts provided to Host Church PW Moderator by PWP Treasurer).

*Offering recipient, designated mission project, and Silent Auction proceeds recipient will be provided by PWPCT.

Lunch

- Lunch is optional and the decision of the Host Church PW. The lunch charge is determined by the Host Church PW and included on the registration form.
- If lunch is not served, recommended nearby restaurants will be listed on the back of the registration form.

BYLAWS OF THE PRESBYTERIAN WOMEN IN THE PRESBYTERY OF NEW HOPE

ARTICLE I - NAME

This organization shall be known as **The Presbyterian Women in the Presbytery of New Hope, Synod of the Mid-Atlantic, Presbyterian Church (USA)**

ARTICLE II- PURPOSE

Forgiven and freed by God in Jesus Christ, and empowered by the Holy Spirit, we commit ourselves:

To nurture our faith through prayer and Bible Study,

To support the mission of the church worldwide,

To work for justice and peace,

To build an inclusive, caring community of women that strengthens the Presbyterian Church (USA) and witnesses to the promise of God's Kingdom.

ARTICLE III - MEMBERSHIP

Members of Presbyterian Women in the Presbytery shall be women who choose to participate in or be in supportive of Presbyterian Women in any way.

ARTICLE IV - COORDINATING TEAM, ELECTION AND TERM OF OFFICE

Section 1: The leaders shall form a Coordinating Team for conducting the business of the Presbyterian Women in the Presbytery.

Section 2: The Search Committee shall present a slate of nominees, which has been approved by the Coordinating Team, to members of Presbyterian Women in the Presbytery at the Annual Gathering. Elected leaders of Presbyterian Women in the Presbytery shall be members of the Presbyterian Church (USA).

Section 3: The Coordinating Team leaders of Presbyterian Women in the Presbytery shall be: Moderator, Vice Moderator or Moderator-Elect, Treasurer, Secretary, Historian, Communications Liaison, Spiritual Enrichment Communicator, Together in Service Communicator, Moderator of Search Committee, PWP Representatives and Justice and Peace Communicator.

Section 4: Positions may be combined or eliminated as determined by the Coordinating Team.

Section 5: The Executive Coordinating Team shall consist of Moderator, Vice Moderator or Moderator-elect, Treasurer, Secretary, a PWP Representative and Parliamentarian.

Section 6: The term of office for all leaders shall be two years, except Moderator-Elect and Vice Moderator. The Vice-Moderator and Moderator-Elect's term of office shall be for one year and a PWP Representative's term of office shall be for two years. Any leader may be considered for re-election to a second term.

Section 7: The officers shall be divided into two groups, elected every two years, except for the Vice-Moderator and Moderator-elect who are elected for one-year terms.

ARTICLE V - DUTIES OF LEADERS

- Section 1: **All leaders** shall abide by the Job Description and Standing Rules of Presbyterian Women of the Presbytery of New Hope.
- Section 2: The **Moderator** shall supervise the planning and coordinating of the total program of Presbyterian Women in the Presbytery. The Moderator shall appoint a Parliamentarian.
- Section 3: The **Vice Moderator**'s term shall be one year, serving during the first year of the Moderator's term. Should the Moderator's position become vacant, the Vice Moderator shall become Moderator and shall hold office through the unexpired term of the Moderator.
- Section 4: The **Moderator-Elect**'s term shall be one year, serving during the second year of the Moderator's term. During this year she shall become familiar with the responsibilities of the Moderator. She shall move into the position of Moderator at the conclusion of the current Moderator's term.
- Section 5: The **Treasurer** shall have knowledge and understanding of all procedures regarding receipts and disbursements of operating funds of Presbyterian Women in the Presbytery.
- Section 6: The **Secretary** shall maintain and preserve working records of Presbyterian Women in the Presbytery.
- Section 7: The **Historian** shall maintain and preserve historical records of Presbyterian Women in the Presbytery.
- Section 8: The **Together in Service Communicator** shall be responsible for interpreting Missions and Special Giving opportunities, such as: Birthday Offering, Thank Offering and Honorary Life Memberships.

Section 9: The **Spiritual Enrichment Communicator** shall communicate through written form and workshops, information on events and materials to encourage spiritual growth. She shall serve as Chaplain to the Coordinating Team.

Section 10: The **Moderator of the Search Committee** shall serve as chair of the committee, comprising of no less than the PWP Representatives, to establish a data bank of Presbyterian Women for leadership positions in the Presbytery. She shall present to the Coordinating Team of the Presbyterian Women of the Presbytery a slate of prospective names for approval no later than the Coordinating Team meeting immediately preceding the Annual Gathering. If approved by the Coordinating Team, this slate is to be presented as her report at the Annual Gathering. Vacancies for unexpired terms shall be filled by nominations by the Search Committee and approval by the Coordinating Team.

Section 11: The **PWP Representatives** shall provide program support to Presbyterian Women in the congregations assigned to them and shall be the direct links between Presbyterian Women in the congregations and the Coordinating Team of Presbyterian Women in the Presbytery.

Section 12: The **Justice and Peace Communicator** shall be responsible for educating and raising awareness of issues of concern about justice and peace for women and children, maintaining and expanding PW Justice and Peace network, encouraging the use of inclusive and expansive language, strengthening the relationship between PW and the United Nations Commission on the Status of Women, and encouraging PW to attend conferences and workshops for justice and peace. She shall also communicate key issues for justice and peace identified by the Synod or Presbytery CTs.

Section 13: The **Communications Liaison** shall compose and distribute the PWP newsletter, The Prompter; electronically distribute the annual Handbook; share events and updates with the New Hope Presbytery for inclusion in their newsletter and/or Facebook, as appropriate; and lead workshops on social media as requested by the Moderator.

ARTICLE VI - DUTIES OF THE COORDINATING TEAM

The Coordinating Team shall:

- a. Plan for all Gatherings of Presbyterian Women of the Presbytery.
- b. Identify issues of concern to Presbyterian Women.
- c. Provide program support and resources.

ARTICLE VII – FINANCES

Section 1: Presbyterian Women of the Presbytery is supported by the Presbyterian Women of local congregations.

Section 2: The local Presbyterian Women shall pay annually to the Presbyterian Women of the Presbytery, through the Mission Pledge, to support the work of the Presbyterian Women of the Presbytery, Synod and Church wide.

Section 3: The budget for the year shall be submitted by the Finance Committee to the Coordinating Team for approval no later than the meeting immediately preceding the Annual Gathering, and then to the Annual Gathering for adoption.

Section 4: The Coordinating Team of the Presbyterian Women of the Presbytery shall be given authority to disburse surplus funds at its discretion.

Section 5: All persons receiving funds from Presbyterian Women of the Presbytery shall submit proper documentation through the Moderator to the Treasurer.

Section 6: The Treasurer shall be the Moderator of the Finance Committee, which shall be composed of two (2) members appointed by the Moderator.

ARTICLE VIII – GATHERINGS

Presbyterian Women in the Presbytery shall meet at least **annually** and more often if appropriate. The date of these Gatherings shall be set by the Coordinating Team of the Presbyterian Women of the Presbytery. These Gatherings shall be open to all women. The election and installation of the leaders and adoption of the budget shall be done in the context of the Annual Gathering. All members of Presbyterian Women attending this Gathering shall be entitled to vote.

ARTICLE IX – AMENDMENTS

Section 1: These bylaws may be amended by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of those present and voting, at an Annual Gathering, provided notice of the proposed amendment has been submitted by the Coordinating Team of the Presbyterian Women in the Presbytery and to the Presbyterian Women in the churches at least 30 days prior to the Annual Gathering.

Section 2: Proposed amendments from local Presbyterian Women shall be submitted in writing, signed by at least two (2) members of the local Presbyterian Women to the Coordinating Team.

ARTICLE X – QUORUM

The quorum for any regular or properly called Gathering of Presbyterian Women in the Presbytery shall consist of those attending along with at least two (2) officers of the Coordinating Team.

ARTICLE XI - PARLIAMENTARY AUTHORITY

Robert's Rules of Order, newly revised, shall govern Presbyterian Women in the case to which they are applicable and to which they are not inconsistent with these Bylaws, the Bylaws of the Presbyterian Women and the Presbyterian Church (USA).
